Former Spalding County Sheriff Dwayne Gilbert, 91, has gone far and above the call of duty in supporting his beloved Bulldogs. Sheriff Gilbert is a great story, having attended his first Georgia football game in 1948 and has been to 630 games since then. He once had a perfect attendance record of 528 straight games. He has also attended 42 straight bowl games.

For many years, Sheriff Gilbert would bring his motor home to Athens and stay the month for the entire spring football practice.

As if all this devotion were not enough, Gilbert states he has never missed a play during the games in his entire life. He says he didn't come to the Georgia football games to go to the restroom or concession stand while the Dawgs were playing football!

Sheriff Gilbert, who served our country as a U.S. Marine, living his life by the Marine motto, "Semper Fidelis"- Always Faithful -which epitomizes the essence of the "Ole Faithful Dawg" Award.



Hix Mizell was born January 1, 1924. He graduated from North Fulton High School in 1942. In 1943 he attended Air Force Gunnery School and Radio Operator School. In 1944, he was commissioned as a Flight Officer, which is equivalent to Second Lieutenant, flying B 24 Bombers. In 1945, he transitioned to B 29 Bombers. He enrolled in the University of Georgia in the fall of 1946.

His earliest memories of Georgia football goes back to the 1942 Georgia-Georgia Tech game in Athens. Georgia beat Tech that day 34-0. Georgia would receive a Rose Bowl invitation and they beat UCLA. The Dogs were consensus National Champions that year.

Hix has followed Georgia's recruitment of football players since 1955 on a daily basis. He was the President of the 1957 Atlanta Bulldog Club. He has had a close friendship with the football coaching staff and many players over a span of 5 decades.

Hix said "I am hesitant to list names of all of my favorite football players









knowing that I could possibly leave someone out. But, I do cherish the great memories of Georgia football: such as the 1942 Georgia-Georgia Tech game, beating Tech in 1957 to end the drought, the resurgence of Georgia football in the late 1960s, and the 1980 National Championship. I have fond memories of Coach Mark Richt, who is a fine man and a fine coach. I'm extremely excited about the direction of Georgia football under the leadership of Coach Kirby Smart."

Upon being notified that he would receive the Faithful Old Dog award, Hix said, "At first I was surprised and then it inspired me to witness another National Championship in the near future."

Loran Smith Visits with the Legendary Pat Hodgson

BOGART – Pat Hodgson, the centerpiece of the Moore-to-Hodgsonto-Taylor-Glory touchdown pass in 1965, is getting about gingerly these days-owning to ankle surgery. It hasn't diminished his status as an engaging raconteur. From his days in Athens to his multiple NFL affiliations.

His NFL coaching stops included San Diego, New York (Giants), Pittsburgh and New York, the last time in the Big Apple with the Jets. He spent one year as a receiver with the Washington

Redskins. He will be best remembered for his participation in the flea flicker, however.

On that September day in 1965, defending national champion, Alabama, came to town. Also on hand were Jim Simpson (play-by-play) and Bud Wilkinson (color), representing NBC. That was the first network televised game between the hedges.

That Alabama was favored came as no surprise. The Tide was coached by the legend of Tuscaloosa, Bear Bryant, who had enjoyed years of seasoned recruiting. Georgia had second year coach named Vince Dooley who was fielding an upstart team which had surprised the SEC with seven wins the year before, including a bowl win over Donny Anderson and Texas Tech in the Sun Bowl.

With time running out and hopes fading, Kirby Moore threw a "dying duck" pass to a button hooking Hodgson who caught the pass and shoveled it back to a sprinting Bob Taylor who raced past the Alabama defense on a 73 yard play that bought the 'Dogs within a point of the visiting team. Vince called time out, huddled with the offensive coaches, principally his brother, Bill, the offensive coordinator. It didn't take long for them to make up their minds. They would be attempting a two point conversion.

By that time, Wilkinson, the former Oklahoma coach was on the field to prepare to interview the winning coach and was taken with Vince's coaching demeanor and aplomb. Vince told the exited Wilkinson, "We're going for two." Wilkinson gushed, "We've got to."

In addition to recalling that play over lunch at the Georgia Club with Robert Wall earlier this week, Hodgson offered colorful and insightful commentary about his two plus decades in the NFL



In 1977, he had moved to Texas Tech, for a coaching opportunity with Rex Dockery, but a funny thing happened on the way to Lubbock or before he had unpacked his bags. He got a call from Ray Perkins (offensive coordinator of the Chargers), offering him a job, on behalf of Tommy Prothro, at San Diego. Before you could say Tijuana, Prothro got fired early in the season. Don Coryell was hired and at the end of the year, Perkins had become the head coach of

the New York Giants.

Perkins hired Hodgson to coach the wide receivers, but before he left for New York, Coryell asked Hodgson to hang around for a week and work with his new wide receiver coach and bring him up to date on the Charger offense and personnel. That coach happened to be Joe Gibbs.

Then Hodgson gets a call from Bill Parcells, with whom he worked at Florida State. Parcells was at the Air Force Academy and had NFL ambitions. Hodgson recommended Parcels to Perkins. You know the rest of the story.

Hodgson later coached with the Steelers but went back to New York when Parcells took the Jets job in 1996. Hodgson spent 12 years working with Bill Belichick and is not the least surprised at the success of the Patriot coach.

When David Andrews finished his last year at Georgia, he had a conversation with Hodgson and was depressed. It was apparent that he would not be invited to the combine. Pat offered him, "keep your chin up" advice, telling Andrews not to worry; that he would be able to land somewhere as a free agent. Hodgson then called his friend, whose nickname is, "Doom." He told Belichick that he should give the graduating Bulldog a "close look." Belichick took the advice of his old friend and was immediately impressed. After the second minicamp, Hodgson got a text form his old buddy. "Thanks. This kid (Andrews) is going to be my starting center.

Hodgson is not given to holding court, but he has limitless stories that bring about two hour lunches and leaving his audience wanting more. Even though I have experienced such outings for years, every gathering seems to bring

about more insightful banter. Like Robert Wall, I am ready for the next lunch.







Circle of Honor

Congratulations to Hines Ward (1994-97) and posthumously George Poschner (1940-42) on the upcoming induction into the University of Georgia Circle of Honor on February 8, 2019 at the West End Zone.

George Poschner

A native of Youngstown, Ohio, and a high school teammate of UGA great Frank Sinkwich, Poschner earned letters as an end on three Georgia teams from 1940-42. He earned firstteam All-America honors, as well as All-SEC first team, after the national championship season of 1942.



A key victory for Georgia during the 1942 season was a 21-10 come-from-behind win over Alabama. Poschner caught two fourth-quarter touchdown passes from his friend Sinkwich to lead the Bulldogs to victory. Georgia closed out the season by defeating UCLA 9-0 in the Rose Bowl and claiming the national championship, the first in program history.

Poschner earned even greater distinction after his graduation from UGA in 1943. Enlisting in the Army, he earned a Purple Heart, Bronze Star and the Distinguished Service Cross for his actions in combat during the Battle of the Bulge in January of 1945. Shot in the head by a German sniper, Poschner lay in a snow drift for three days before being discovered by a U.S. graves registration unit. By the time he was evacuated, however, he had become so badly frostbitten that doctors amputated both of his legs, as well as the fingers in his right hand.

A member of the Georgia Sports (1982) and Orange Bowl (1985) Halls of Fame, Poschner passed away in 2004 at the age of 85.

2019 Georgia Sports Hall of Fame

Hines Ward

In an age of specialization, Hines Ward excelled as a versatile offensive weapon during his four years as a Georgia Bulldog (1994-97).

Ward touched the ball 515 times during 42 career games at Georgia: 203 times rushing, 144 receiving, 71 passing and another 48 times as a kick returner. He



averaged 9.3 yards over each of those touches and accounted for 20 touchdowns.

A native of Rex, GA., and a product of Forest Park High School, Ward earned All-SEC first-team honors after his senior season of 1997, when the Bulldogs went 10-2 and defeated Wisconsin in the Outback Bowl. He saw action primarily as a receiver and caught 55 passes for 715 yards and six touchdowns. He also set the school record for receptions in a bowl game when he pulled in 12 passes for 122 yards against the Badgers.

Ward was selected in the third round of the 1997 NFL draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers. He went on to be selected to four Pro Bowls, was a member of two Super Bowl champion teams, and earned MVP honors in Super Bowl 40 in 2006. Ward remains the Steelers' all-time leading receiver with 1,000 catches for 12,083 yards and 85 touchdowns.






